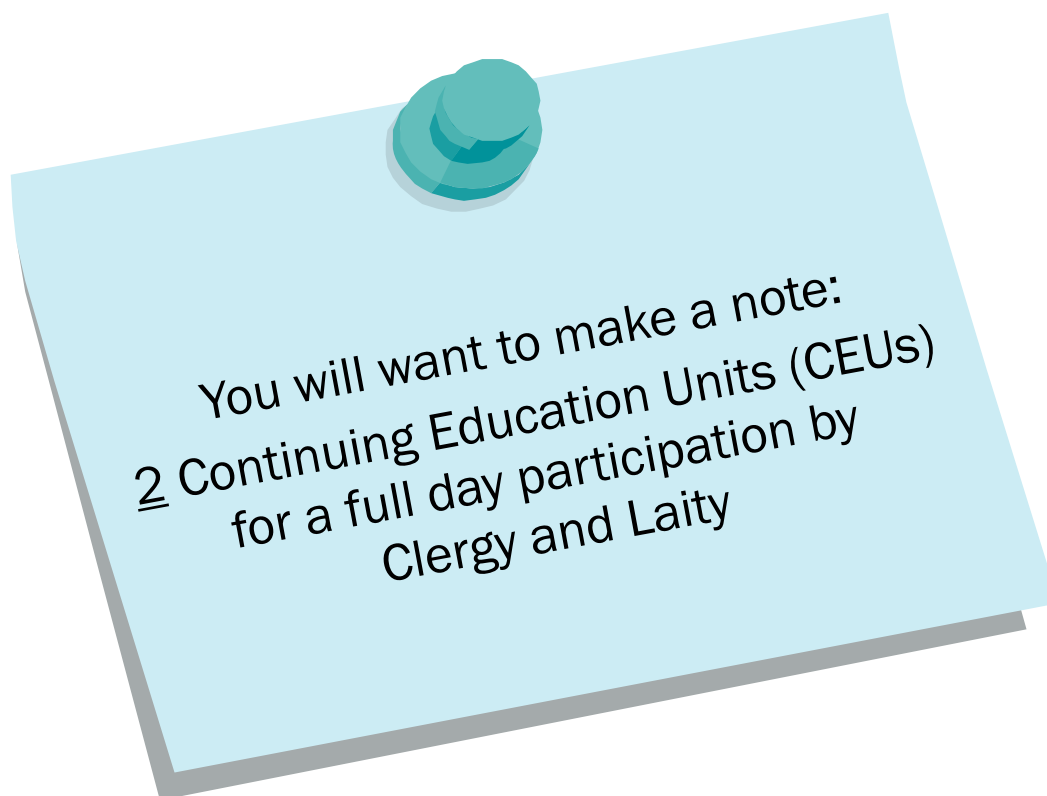

## **SESSION I WORKSHOPS: 9:00 a.m.—10:15 a.m.**

### ► **Deacons in the Liturgy**

***Session I***

For the past year the diocese has been engaged in the Revitalization and Strategic Visioning Project (RSVP). The project is a vehicle to assist us in discerning where we've been, where we are and where God is calling us as a diocese. This workshop will provide information on the process and results to date as well as provide an opportunity to engage in a conversation about the project within the context of being focused on mission rather than maintenance. Following a brief presentation by Canon Gray, participants will be invited into an activity designed to engage more deeply the dreams and desires that God reveals to us through our relationships within community. Whether you have been to an RSVP event or not, this workshop is designed to strengthen our understanding of the project and the journey we share.

**► Prayers of the People**

This workshop will examine the Liturgical and Spiritual use of the "Prayers of the People" portion of our worship... The Prayers of the People have been a part of our Liturgy for at least 30 years. They became "official" with the implementation of the 1979 Prayer Book. Prior to that, and still contained in Rite I, was/is the "Prayer for the whole State Christ's Church," Both are still used but often in the same old repeating styles. We will look at new ways to enhance this portion of the liturgy and give it new power.

As Rector of St. Paul's, Lansing, Father Gordon serves as the chief priest and spiritual leader of the parish.

An opportunity for wardens of congregations to engage in discussion with Bishop Gibbs regarding their roles and responsibilities. What are the wardens' responsibilities—canonical, pastoral, etc.—to the congregation, to the rector, and to the diocese? What does it mean to be the Ecclesiastical Authority in times of transition? What are the various roles the wardens might share in? How can you enrich your ministry as a warden? All Junior and Senior wardens are encouraged to attend.

### ***Session II***

A study of public-school principals reveals that half of the principals surveyed view bullying as a serious problem at their schools, yet they appear to underestimate the extent of the harassment that students undergo.

The workshop will focus on the causes of bullying and its psychological and pragmatic consequences. A panel of perpetrators and survivors may testify to their experience and its effects on their lives and the lives of their families.

▶ **Healing Racism: Introduction**  
**Seeing The Face of God in Each Other**

### ***Session II***

This introductory session will answer several questions about required diocesan training and the Diocese of Michigan's commitment to heal racism in our church family. Why is this workshop necessary? Why is it required for selected lay ministers and those in the process of ordination? You seem to be saying that there is racism in our diocese, I don't see it...can you tell me where it is? What is the content and process of the workshop? If we take this workshop, how will it change anything?

In a world where violence, war, drugs and violence seem to dominate the media, how can you follow the teachings of Scripture and make peace? Fr. Peter will share his experiences of the last half century and provide workshop participants with opportunities to learn about domestic and international peace teams as well as local peace making efforts. This workshop is perfect for students to retirees who are seeking a deeper meaning of peace and an opportunity to implement the words of Jesus Christ.

Fr. Peter Dougherty founded the Michigan Peace Team 17 years ago as an expression of his life's working: making and promoting peace in the world. Fr. Peter, recipient of the 2009 Jamnalal Bajaj Foundation International award for Fostering Gandhian Values, is an internationally recognized peace activist and educator. He's an accomplished singer and guitarist, using music to convey his mission of peace.

The world has made some progress towards the MDG of eliminating, by half, extreme poverty by the year 2015. The current progress report of the eight MDGs will be revealed. St. Philip's Rochester project working with St. Mary's Anglican Church in Axim, Ghana, Africa provides a Head Start type program for extremely poor children. This program has been an example for other Ghana churches to open schools and will be used to demonstrate how a successful international project was established in our diocese. Microloans have been successful worldwide in lifting families out of poverty; discussion will include our use of microloans to improve school attendance.

SAFEGUARDING GOD'S CHILDREN is an in-depth educational and training program for preventing and responding to child sexual abuse in everyday life and in ministry. This workshop covers prevention, detection and reporting guidelines for clergy, Sunday School teachers, nursery workers, vestry members, and others who work regularly with minors in our churches.

This program was created by in response to General Convention Resolution B008, Protection of Children and Youth from Abuse, which mandates training in sexual abuse prevention.

SAFEGUARDING GOD'S PEOPLE is the diocesan requirement for anyone in a pastoral or one-on-one situation with adults, such as Eucharistic Visitor or Pastoral Caregiver. This is an afternoon workshop and participants need to be present for the entire session to receive credit for attendance.

Training includes issues of sexual harassment and exploitation, and guidelines for the prevention of misconduct in all pastoral relationships. The topics addressed cover healthy boundaries, high risk situations, abuse of power, accountability, ethical and theological concerns and diocesan policies and procedures for insuring safety in our congregations.

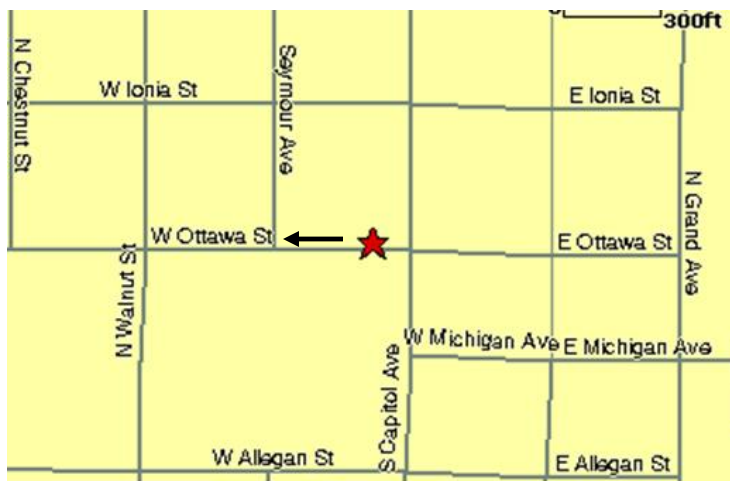

**From the North or South:** Take 127 to Grand River exit (one way street west) that turns into Oakland. Take Oakland to Capitol Avenue. Turn left on Capitol to Ottawa. Turn right on Ottawa and proceed one block. The church is on the corner of Ottawa & Seymour St., the north side of the Capitol Building.

**From the West:** Take I-496 into downtown Lansing (Exit 6) - Pine and Walnut St. Turn left on Walnut St. (north). Go one block past Ottawa St. and turn right on to Ionia St. Go one block east and then turn right onto Seymour St. Entrance to Roosevelt parking structure on the left.
